Chula Vista Water by Joe de Leon M.D.

The Lake Chapala area is located in a volcanic zone. Our water flows through layers of volcanic rock. This rock contains a variety of elements. Some elements are toxic; some are not. Some of the toxic elements are arsenic, cadmium, lead, chromium 6, fluoride, mercury, nitrates and nitrites (when in high levels) and some radioactive minerals. Other non-toxic elements in the water are copper and manganese. When there are unacceptable levels of toxic elements in our water, we notify the community, as happened last year when there was a question about arsenic in the water.

One of the elements in our water is manganese. When the water is chlorinated, the manganese turns into manganese chloride. This state of manganese is not toxic to humans, but when it is present in chlorinated water, it turns into a brown-grey sludge. It colors the water and causes stains on walls and pipes. Some people have noticed this sludge in their pipes, showers, and pools.

While our water is potable and does not pose a health risk, some folks may prefer to use bottled water for drinking or to install a filtration system. There are a number of different types of filtration systems. One system uses paper filers. These types of filters tear easily and have to be changed frequently. Another system uses a sand filter to trap the manganese chloride and other sediments. Filtration systems can be installed at the point where water enters the property.

Water is our most precious asset. The water system is monitored very four months, chlorinated automatically to international standards and analyzed for pathogenic bacteria, parasites and hydrocarbons. We are vigilant in protecting the quality of our water.
